Senator Hester noted that the Joint Committee has a hearing scheduled for December 4. The focus for the hearing has not yet been announced. She asked members to consider whether it would be useful to have the Joint Committee take up the issue of cyber education and workforce development as a vehicle for raising the L V V profile and identifying policy needs that the subcommittee might examine.
